New Hanover Reformed Church (In its early days it was known as the Falckner Swamp Reformed Church, founded in 1725). Records from the church under her separate names are below.

The below notes include notes for John Jacob Nieman:

John Jacob Nauman (Nieman, Neuman) was born May 15, 1727 (alternate date, May 25, 1730), and died February 8, 1790 in New Hanover, Montgomery County, PA. He married Catharina Reifsynder on date unknown.

It is believed that John Jacob Nauman (Nieman, Neuman), who died in New Hanover, Montgomery County in 1790, was the father of Elizabeth Newman (1758-1822) who married Conrad Frankenberger (1755-1815). It is also believed that after John Jacob Sr's death in 1790, Catharina lived with another daughter Barbara and her husband Andre Bittle. No source material is yet extant to confirm his daughters named above.

From Church Records Falkner Swamp Reformed Church, New Hanover, Montgomery County: The earliest Neuman Baptism is in 1776 which is the birth of John Jacob son of Jacob and Catharine. While the Falkner Swamp records begin around 1747-48 there are significant gaps in the records most notably between 1752 and 1772, thus pertinent information about the family is lost.
